How to search through the RECAS Repository

The RECAS Repository can be searched by using several categories of tags which offer a simple overview of documents based on different types of information.

You can search for documents using the following tags:

Basic information on the document – with four simple tags that enable search by:

- title of the publication,
- author's name,
- language in which the document is written,
- year of publication.

Thematic areas – includes a list of tags referring to the area of the public policy that the topic of the document belongs to, and includes the following fields:

- SDG 2 Zero Hunger: End hunger, promote agriculture, and provide food for every person.
- SDG 3 Good Health and Well-being:
 Ensure health and provide care for everyone regardless of their age.
- SDG 4 Quality Education: Ensure quality education that is equitable and inclusive.
- SDG 5 Gender Equality: Eradicate gender-based discrimination and empower all women.
- SDG 6 Clean Water and Sanitation:
 Ensure and develop appropriate
 water supply and waste disposal
 systems.
- SDG 7 Affordable and Clean Energy:
 Provide access to affordable, reliable and modern energy.
- SDG 8 Decent Work and Economic Growth: Provide constant and inclusive enhancement of economic activities.
- SDG 9 Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure: Develop resilient infrastructure and enhance creativity.
